If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: <sup>5</sup> circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup> as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

#### Markers of Paul's Worldview

- monotheism

(one God revealed in Jesus the Christ)

- land
  - (cosmos promised by God to forefathers)
- election

(chosen by God, all who are in Christ)

- covenant

(guidelines for relationship with God, as it points to its fulfillment in Christ)

\* circumcision, purity – no longer are they the outward markers, replaced by 'in Christ' markers - e.g. fruits of the spirit


#### When Paul sees Jesus...
