





Jesus is tempted...





John 1:14

So the Word became flesh and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.





Here is the heart, the center, the beginning and the end of the gospel: the heart, the center, the beginning and the end of history. God, the eternal God, Creator of the heavens and the earth, became like us, a vulnerable, mortal human being. He became as a baby needing a mother, conceived in her flesh nourished at her breast needing her love and the love and presence of Joseph in order to grow and develop as a human being. He "dwelt amongst us," which can be translated "put up his tent amongst us." He became a pilgrim and a brother, walking through the desert with us. He became part of history revealing to us a way to God and to universal peace.

"made his home" – σκηνόω – to live, dwell σκηνή – tabernacle (exodus typology)


Exodus 40


34 Then the cloud covered the Tabernacle, and the glory of the Lord filled the Tabernacle. 35 Moses could no longer enter the Tabernacle because the cloud had settled down over it, and the glory of the Lord filled the Tabernacle.

36 Now whenever the cloud lifted from the Tabernacle, the people of Israel would set out on their journey, following it. 37 But if the cloud did not rise, they remained where they were until it lifted. 38 The cloud of the Lord hovered over the Tabernacle during the day, and at night fire glowed inside the cloud so the whole family of Israel could see it. This continued throughout all their journeys.

Jesus joins us in the wilderness...





