## Transportation Dance

*You'll need to: Visit YouTube and watch "The Transportation Song" by the Singing Walrus*

Dance along with "The Transportation Song". Try to move your body like the vehicles mentioned in the song—and when they sing "faster", move as fast as you can!

## Sea, Land, Sky

*You'll need: Just your body!*

This is a quick game to get the wiggles out! Begin by yelling out the name of a method of transportation (ie—bicycle, train, submarine, etc.) Your child must call out where that vehicle travels (sea, land, or sky), and do an action: sea—lie down on the ground, land—stay standing, sky—jump as high as they can. The faster you call out vehicles, the trickier it is!

Reverse Option: Call out sea, land, or sky. Your child must name a vehicle that travels in that location, and move their body like that vehicle.

## Toilet Paper Roll Car

*You'll need: Scissors, a toilet paper roll, 4 buttons or lids, glue, markers/crayons*

Cut a U-shape in the cardboard tube (toilet paper or paper towel roll), and fold it backwards to create an opening for toys to sit in. (You may want to cut the folded piece smaller). Let your child decorate the tube however they'd like, then use white or hot glue to glue on 4 wheels. Now your car is ready to drive!
